

BARCROFT SCHOOL AND CIVIC LEAGUE

Minutes of the Meeting of September 7, 1989

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 by President Randy Swart. Reading of the minutes of the previous meeting and the Treasurer's report were deferred. The Civic Federation delegates' report was also deferred since the most recent meeting had been only a candidate's night.

2. Announcements by the President.

- ◆ The BSCL will participate in a Columbia Pike Revitalization Organization flea market on October 7. James and Patricia Davis are handling our table and we need donations of household items to sell.
- ◆ The BSCL will hold an Open House on October 21. Annette Osso and David Michaelson volunteered to chair the event committee.
- ◆ The BSCL needs a refreshments chairman. Jean Menefee volunteered for the job.
- ◆ Mitch Delsack of 506 Wakefield is asking the County for a variance to split his lot, although he lacks enough square footage and street footage. The Delsacks will build a new home for themselves on the second lot and sell their current home. Mr. Delsack is asking his neighbors to sign a note stating that they have no objection to the variance. The BSCL will reconstitute its Land Use and Zoning Committee to consider the question of taking a position on the variance.


3. Karen Rogers, a Barcroft resident and chair of the Barcroft Elementary School PTA, spoke briefly about the school and the PTA and invited interested parents to join.

4. Program. Col. Jim Erwin of the National Guard, with Hal Davis of Metcalf and Associates introduced Don Zimmer and Kent Bond, who are consultants to the National Guard for the asbestos removal project at Arlington Hall. Mr. Bond explained the project and their procedures, which include monitoring the number of asbestos fibers released into the air around the site. The plans sounded thorough. Some members were concerned that the National Guard has no evacuation plan in the event of a catastrophic fire or explosion, which could release asbestos into the atmosphere. They would only notify the County, but did not know specifically who they would call. They have not yet

addressed the question of PCB pollution from the transformers formerly on the site.

5. Dues. The members authorized payment of annual dues of \$30 to the Arlington County Civic Federation and \$45 to CPRO.
6. Delegates. Annette Osso was introduced a Barcroft's representative to CPRO, and a member of the CPRO Board. Meril-Lee Pattison was introduced as Barcroft's representative to the Neighborhood Conservation Advisory Committee.
6. Parade. Members looked at pictures from Barcroft's first 4th of July parade. They saw Talmadge Williams' fine slides of the event.
5. The meeting adjourned.
