

BARCROFT SCHOOL AND CIVIC LEAGUE
Minutes of the Meeting of September 6, 1990

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 by President Randy Swart. Approximately 20 people attended the meeting. Minutes from June's meeting were read and approved. The reading of the Treasurer's report was deferred.

2. Anne Knoll said that the Arlington County Civic Federation had recently met with November's candidates. Unfortunately she also said that Ed knowles had a heart attack during the break, ending the meeting. He was in the hospital at the time of the BSCL meeting.

3. Randy called attention to the availability of copies of the recent Washington Post article on Barcroft. He also said that dues were due and that the CPRO directory was out.

4. Diane Sawyer then led a discussion on crime in the neighborhood. The focal point of concern was the High-Cue pool hall at the corner of George Mason and Columbia Pike at the corner of the neighborhood. The main results of the discussion were heightened community concern and a commitment to bring our concerns to the owner of the pool hall. A letter requesting a meeting between the pool hall owner and BSCL was circulated. Many people signed it.

5. Pat Roach then led a discussion on the Arlington Hall property. The area including the ball field in our neighborhood is now open and available for public use. Unfortunately, the old building on the property may not be torn down until 1993. The GSA has approved National Guard use of the building until then.

6. We then watched James Hurley's video of the 4th of July parade.

7. The meeting adjourned at approximately 9:30.
