

## Native Evergreens for Winter Interest

Winter is a time when we especially look to evergreen plants to provide interest

in our gardens. Take a look at several native species which can add beauty to your home landscape while providing support to wildlife.

The familiar berry-like drupes of American Holly (*Ilex opaca*), often used in holiday decorations, remain on this evergreen tree from October into winter on female plants, providing food for 18 bird species. (A male tree is required within 200 feet to assure fruit production.) The 15 - to 40-foot tree can be used

in the garden as a specimen or a tall hedge, providing cover and nesting sites for birds. A native shrub to consider is Winter-

> berry (Ilex verticillata), a deciduous holly of 6 to 12 feet. Its brilliant fruit matures on female plants from late August to September and decorates the plant into early spring, providing a winter food source for 48 species of birds. An appropriately matched male plant can be grouped with as many as 6 to 10 females within 40 feet. # Understanding Your Flood Risk in Arlington

Flooding can be the most frequent and costly disaster in a community. The likelihood of flooding changes over time due to erosion, changing land use, changing weather patterns, and other factors. Nobody is exempt from flood risk - where it can rain, it can flood.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is in the process of updating flood insurance rate maps (FIRM) for Arlington County. The new maps reflect current flood risk based on the latest data and a more accurate understanding of our area's topography. As a result, property owners throughout Arlington will have up-to-date, Internetaccessible information about flood risk to your property.

There are several ways to view the preliminary FIRM maps on the County's website, including links to FEMA's website: https://environment.arlingtonva.us/floodinsurance-rate-maps/. Even if your property is not in the special flood hazard area, you are still strongly recommended to purchase flood insurance. Over a 30-year time period, you are about three times more likely to have a flood in your home than a fire, and most homeowners' insurance policies do not provide coverage for damage due to flooding. To learn more about flood insurance rates and what options are available to you, we recommend that you contact your insurance agent.

An additional resource for property

owners is www.floodsmart.gov, which provides information about the National Flood Insurance Policy (NFIP) and the costs of flood insurance. ●

Continued from page 1 to the Glencarlyn Library Garden, while 'Winter Gold' with bright orange drupes and her partner 'Southern Gentleman' are located not far from the garden's 3rd Street entry path.

At ground level, Christmas Fern (Polystichum acrostichoides), located in

the Glencarlyn Library Garden's shade garden, can be used under shrubs and trees, along shaded walls, on slopes, or in woodland and rock gardens. This plant, which gets its com-

mon name from its evergreen nature and its stocking-shaped pinnae, forms a circular, cascading clump of one half to two feet that increases over time, offering cover to songbirds. In the spring, its dark green, leathery fronds are renewed with silvery, scaled fiddleheads that some birds use in nest construction. **Editor's Note:** Elaine Mills gave a talk on Climate Conscious Gardening at the November Barcroft Community Meeting.

How does the recent election and Covid 19 impact the recent estate market? The recent news that Joe Biden is now president-elect drew positive reactions from the real estate and mortgage industry, who see the upside for the housing market.

Biden's housing proposals include a \$15,000 first-time homebuyer tax credit and he will focus on fair housing and affordable housing issues. Overall a Biden administration will favor the housing market.
