### President's Report

At last month's meeting, the members in attendance approved the following:

1. Unanimous support was given to the Demeter House in their request to the County to change the use permit wording from "Mothers with children and mothers" to "Women, mothers with children and mothers." Also unanimously supported (with three abstentions) was their effort to increase the maximum number of adults allowed from 14 to 16. This simply states that Barcroft supports Demeter in

this effort. This still needs approval from the County Board. The Barcroft Advisory Committee on Demeter House is always looking for new members. Please contact Pat Williamson at pwilliamson@weta.com.

2. By unanimous consent, a resolution was approved requesting that the County rename the Arlington Hall park (on S. Taylor Street north of S. 4th Street) to "Anne Noll Park." Once approved, this will be a great honor for a great Barcroft resident. This resolution and request is now in the County pipeline. We'll keep you posted as to its progress.

Please mark your calendars: the first meeting of the New Year will be Thursday January 6. The meeting will start at 7:30 pm as usual.

### **WMATA Bus Depot Pipeline Project**

Washington Gas is working with the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) to construct a pipeline to provide natural gas service to the Four Mile Run bus depot located at 3501 South Glebe Road in Arlington. WMATA is updating the bus depot to fuel and maintain a fleet of passenger buses operating with compressed natural gas (CNG) in Arlington County. The WMATA CNG bus fleet is part of a comprehensive Arlington County government initiative aimed at addressing air quality issues and reducing ground-level ozone in the Washington metropolitan region.

Construction of this pipeline may affect traffic for Barcroft residents. The route of the pipeline will begin at the gas feed at the intersection of Columbia Pike and S. Wakefield. From there, the route follows South Wakefield to South Four Mile Run Drive (minor). It will then follow South Four Mile Run Drive (minor) east to Walter Reed, where it will drop down to South Four Mile Run Drive

(major) and continue to Shirlington Road. At Shirlington Road, it will cross Virginia Concrete and I-395, and continue east on South Four Mile Run Drive to the intersection of South Glebe Road and West Glebe Road. The pipeline will then follow South Glebe Road eastward, through South Arlington Ridge Road and up to South Fern Street. It will then wind its way on Fern and 31st Street South to South Eads Street and ultimately to the WMATA depot entrance.

Construction is slated to begin in February 2005, and will start at S. Wakefield and Columbia Pike. Construction should be completed by July 2005. For more information about the project, please call the Washington Gas Virginia Public Affairs office at 703 750 5637.

It is much to my dismay, and disappointment, that some neighbors took it upon themselves to disrespect an honored tradition that occurs every year - the political election process. I'm not sure they Barcroft residents, but suspect so. The disappointment was two fold. First a woman, seen by my wife but unidentifiable or known, decided to take down some of the campaign signs on my property. The second, someone decided to destroy a campaign, taking part of it and leaving part of it torn up on my lawn. This doesn't seem like the Bar-

croft folk around me and others in the neighborhood that I know. One thing I do know is that they were anti Bush supporters. Here in Barcroft we have fought tooth and nail over issues. Sometimes are differences were heated and driven by a lot of emotion. But there was a still respect for the divergent positions we took. I don't seem to recall hostilities getting beyond the issue. It is fair to stand up for an issue or campaign for any candidate of choice, but it is not in our system to attack/destroy property of those expressing views that we may not agree with.

### **CPIT Update**

The Columbia Pike Implementation Team has met the last couple months to discuss sidewalk design and receive updates for projects along the Pike. The sidewalk will be compliant with ADA (American Disabilities Act) accessibility guidelines, provide a clear zone of at least six feet, and include a variety of paving materials. Plenty of benches and bike racks will be installed outside of updates from the County on talks with VDOT to the clear zone of the sidewalks by developers and the county as new development occurs. Project updates include the completion of the left turn lanes at Glebe Road and the installation of a median with a pedestrian signal at Frederick Street by the County. Some exciting news is that

WMATA has narrowed its recommendations for new transit along the Pike to trolley, BRT (Bus Rapid Transit), or to leave the bus service as is. WMATA will have a final recommendation by the end of the first quarter of 2005. In the next few meetings we will be discussing the design of the Super Stops proposed by WMATA, receive lower the speed limit along the Pike to 25 MPH, and receive updates on private development projects. 
