\$26 Million for Arlington Mill Community Center

Did you know that this November you will have the opportunity to vote for each of five bond issues in Arlington? The following bonds will be on the ballot, November 7:

- Local Parks and Recreation
- Metro and Transportation Projects
- Community Infrastructure
- Utilities
- Arlington Public School Projects

The first bond listed may be of special interest to residents of Barcroft because a large portion (approximately 26 million dollars) has been included for the Arlington Mill Community Center. The County is currently pursuing a publicprivate partnership to construct the new building. This partnership will create opportunities for residential, retail, and commercial components. The new community center will be a mixed-use facility which will continue to provide needed social services and current programming for preschool, elementary, teens, seniors and adults.

The new facility will serve a wider variety of needs, interests and income ranges and make available new opportunities for enhanced recreational and educational programs. It will include a new gymnasium to serve multiple purposes, a fitness room, multi-purpose rooms, landscaping, a plaza, and a link to the adjacent park along Four Mile Run stream.





I remember 10 years ago when MaryAnne O'Rourke handed over the reins of parade organizer and said "It practically organizes itself...just a little running around the last two weeks" as she giggled and waved good luck!

My first parade, the 8th annual, was a blur. I remember the 9th as the biggest ever and one that almost overwhelmed the community. We had some major publicity leading up to the day with a large article in the Washington Post. We had a Space theme celebrating our place in space and the 4th of July landing of NASA's Pathfinder spacecraft on Mars. Neighborhood astronaut Guy Gardner was Grand Marshall. We made the NBC national news and even had a Morrocan TV news crew filming the event.

The 10th annual parade had our very own Barcroft elementary Principal Miriam Hughey Guy as Grand Marshall. The theme was built on where your ancestors come from. The Grand Marshall for the 11th annual parade was Ed Flynn, Arlington Police chief and Barcroft resident. For all parades since our Grand Marshall has been Bruce Nunally – our very own Uncle Sam. Bruce has become a regular feature on the Sun Gazette cover after July 4th.

Throughout the years we have had mimes, clowns, a variety of magicians, an acapella group (Chromatics), a teenage garage band (Lady in the Radiator), and Bulgarian Dancers entertain us in the community house. We have been blessed with the talent of the Cackley family, the Barbershop Quartet and other neighbors as we sang the National Anthem.

Part of the fun of the parade itself is not knowing what will turn up. We've seen a Chinese dragon, a space shuttle, the lawn mower brigade (who can ever forget the inverted parallelogram maneuver designed to impress the judging stand), Bulgarian dancers, the Barcroft marching band, the fiddlers, an aerobic dance group, the lone bagpiper, the pregnant bellies, this year's flooded basement float, the Polynesian Princess carried by grass skirted men, and of course we remember old time Barcroft residents Mr. and Mrs. Chalmers as they rode in the back of a pickup. One year we almost had the Oscar Meyer Weinermobile. Oh well. One year we went the wrong way and ended up going down 9th street instead of 8th rd. It was stifling hot as the marchers went up and down the hill and walked the extra distance.

Yes, we have lots of memories of this simple event that "practically organizes itself". We have made it simple. We used to have gate prizes, fliers delivered to all houses, games on the grass, politicians and official guests that required thank you letter follow up. Now it is just a parade, a picnic and an act. Something that starts at 10:00 sharp and is all cleaned up by 12:30 as if nothing had occurred.
