## President's Report

Many Barcrofters attended the October monthly meeting featuring the Arlington County Code Inspectors assigned to our neighborhood. They did a really thorough job of explaining the code enforcement process and outlined ways for neighbors to bring attention to areas of concern.

A very lengthy discussion ensued about the new Barcroft School Sensory Garden. Questions were directed to the code inspectors about the noise generated by the musical instruments in the garden. The code inspectors said that the decibel measurements they had taken in the area were not outside the allowable standard. The inspectors left at the close of their presentation and the discussions continued. It was decided that those concerned about the garden should meet again on October 19 at 7 pm at the School playground to continue the dialogue with

Ms. Hughey-Guy and members of the Police Department. The BSCL members present at the October 5 meeting voted to recommend to the School that the instruments be disabled until a resolution of the concerns could be reached. We thank the School for doing so the following day. Assistant Principal Sandra Lochhead represented the School at the meeting.

We will continue to discuss this topic of the School Garden at the top of the agenda for our November meeting (November 2 at 7:30 p.m.).

We will then hear from the new Columbia Pike Revitalization Organization (CPRO) manager, David Johnson. Mr. Johnson will describe current CPRO activities and upcoming developments. Please plan to attend this meeting.
