The third annual Arlington & Alexandria Community Bike Ride promises to be the best yet! Back due to popular demand, this non-competitive cycling event has been expanded with more miles and more fun. The Community Bike Ride will offer two route options: a 25-mile Tour of both Arlington and Alexandria, mostly on trails and bike lanes, and a shorter 9-mile Family Ride, all on trails. Registration opens at 7am, the Tour starts at 8am, and the Family Ride starts at 8:30am on Sunday, June 3. On the Community Bike Ride, you will see just how easy it is to get around town by bike!

The cost of the Ride is only \$15, children 13 and under are free, so bring the whole family. 
