Carlin Springs Rd., Arlington, VA 22204 Panels and presentations about fire prevention, emergency preparedness, identity theft, auto theft, pedestrian safety, gangs, and internet safety. Fingerprinting for children will be offered at the event.

Elementary School Boundary Changes

Several North Arlington Elementary schools have experienced overcrowding in recent years. For example, overcrowding at Tuckahoe Elementary has forced students there to learn in trailers and cramped their playground space. In addition, several other North Arlington schools anticipate overcrowded in the near future. To address this issue, the Elementary Crowding and Capacity Committee (ECCC), representing all APS elementary schools, gave recommendations to the superintendent.

These recommendations were received by the APS Superintendent, Dr. Robert Smith. He delivered a proposal, of his own, to the school board for approval. The superintendent's proposal affects all but three elementary schools and proposes to move more than 600 students from one school to another through boundary and program changes.

The two changes, included in the superintendent's proposal, that affect Barcroft Elementary are:

- Move two Montessori preschool classrooms to Barcroft. (Montessori preschool classes serve children 3, 4 and 5, including Kindergarten)
- Change the school of choice for parents who opt out of Barcroft's year around calendar from Barrett Elementary to Randolph Elementary.

Overwhelmingly, parents in the APS system have voiced their frustration with the process and disapproval of the superintendent's proposal. Many believe the content of the proposal ignores recommendations from the commission. These parents have packed three public hearings to ask the school board to reject the superintendent's proposal. Another hearing has been scheduled on Tuesday, February 12 at 7:30 PM accommodate all public statements.

New laws impact market in 2008

New federal laws and regulations have created major changes in the mortgage industry. The Mortgage Forgiveness Debt Relief Act - removes the tax burden on mortgage indebtedness, encourages market-based restructuring between lenders & home owners, discouraging foreclosures.

Previously, the tax code required a lender who forgives debt to provide a Form 1099 to the IRS stating the amount the borrower had been forgiven. If the property was sold at foreclosure or short sale the difference was considered income and subject to be taxed. The new legislation provides a temporary, three-year change to the tax code to eliminate taxes homeowners might face when banks renegotiate the terms of a home loan and forgive a portion of the outstanding mortgage balance. The change in the tax law will cap untaxable forgiven debt at \$2 million (principal residences only).

The legislative bill also extends the tax deductibility of FHA and (PMI) premiums over the next 3 years. Homeowners with adjusted gross incomes up to \$100,000 can deduct the full cost of their mortgage insurance premiums. Fixer Upper Bargains
