An update on the improved streetscaping on our part of Columbia Pike, S. Wakefield St. to Four

Mile Run--the utility undergrounding design has been submitted to VDOT and the County has preliminary VDOT approval. Construction is slated to begin on the utility undergrounding by the fall. The project also includes the realignment of South Four Mile Run Dr. (across from S. Buchanan St.). The County is in the process of acquiring a portion of the Goodwill parking lot as well as some additional easements along the project route. Construction of the realignment and streetscape improvements is currently expected to begin by summer 2009.

In other neighborhood news, a special thanks to all of our volunteers for the Snow Brigade this year, headed by the venerable Randy Swart--helping neighbors stay safe in the wintery weather!





On Jan. 31, the Arlington School Board approved the Wakefield project development timeline which directs the Superintendent to reconvene the Wakefield Building Level Planning Committee (BLPC) in February with the understanding that the BLPC will bring to the Public Facilities Review Committee (PFRC) the concept options designed prior to the BLPC's suspension last summer. Arlington Mill Community Center

At its January 29 meeting the County Board endorsed the Arlington Mill Community Center Concept Plan, making it possible to meet the application deadline for an affordable housing tax credit program offered through the Virginia Housing Development Authority.

The project includes a 6-story building at the corner of Columbia Pike and S. Dinwiddie St. that features a new community center with a large gymnasium, residential apartments, some ground floor retail, and a public plaza. To the north along Dinwiddie will be a 5-story residential building. Altogether the project includes just over 200 residences, of which approximately 61 will be affordable units for those at 60% of the area's median household income level.

In order to accommodate this plan, technical adjustments to the Form Based Code were approved by the Board on December 15. These include redrawing the revitalization district boundary to include the northern portion of the Arlington Mill property, designating a portion of Dinwiddie St. as "Avenue" site frontage, and modifying the planned width of Dinwiddie St.

Garden for Those in Need

The Arlington Food Assistance Center (AFAC) is asking local gardeners to grow fruits and vegetables to help feed families in need in Arlington. AFAC – Arlington's food pantry – will provide free seeds to those gardeners willing to donate all or a portion of what they grow.

This year is the second in AFAC's local effort to obtain more fresh produce for the families it serves. It is part of the national Plant A Row for the Hungry program through which gardeners are urged to donate a portion of their vegetables and fruits to local food pantries.

"Last year we received more than 34,000 pounds of fresh produce," said Puwen Lee, the AFAC Plant A Row coordinator. "We hope the enthusiasm and generosity of local gardeners will bring in even more produce this summer."

AFAC Executive Director Christine Lucas noted that over 800 families in needy come to AFAC each week for free supplemental groceries. That's an increase of 20-25 percent over the same period last year. "Fresh fruits and vegetables are an important addition to the non-perishable groceries, milk, meat and bread we supply, and the growing number of client families means we will need even more this summer," she said.

Arlington County Parks and Natural Resources Division is offering 1200 trees to be distributed for this year's Neighborhood Day (Saturday May 10).

Yellow-poplar (Liriodendron tulipifera), a large canopy tree and Allegheny serviceberry (Amenlanchier laevis), a small flowering tree are this year's two selections. These tree 'whips' will be approximately three to five feet in height and potted in one or two-gallon plastic containers. This is a good size for transplanting and future growth success, and is small enough to handle with ease.

On 2/13/08, President Bush signed the economic stimulus package into law, including important housing provisions affecting loan limits for Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac and also FHA.

The loan limits could increase to as much as \$729,750 in high cost areas (to 125% of local median home prices) for loans approved on or before December 31, 2008. Currently Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac are capped at \$417,000, and FHA is capped at \$362,790. The new loan limits will be determined based on the median home price for each Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA).

HUD has been given 30 days to publish the median home price for each MSA. It will take Fannie Mae, Freddie Mac, and FHA another month or so to prepare their systems and implement the changes. It is estimated to be about sixty days before the new higher loan limits will be available. The expected benefit from the new loan limits is that credit will be more widely available and that qualifying loans should have lower rates, making homes more affordable and refinancings more attractive.
