President's Report

Happy Spring to all! Please join us at the next community meeting on Thursday, April 3 at 7:30pm for a discussion of two items which will be shaping the future of the areas surrounding our neighborhood in the months and years to come.

First, we will be discussing the plans for developing the site of the former Bob & Edith's diner at Buchanan Street and Columbia Pike. We have invited the developers of the site to join us in person for this meeting to relay their plans and take your comments and questions.

At the last meeting we were joined by the Arlington County Code Enforcement officers for a useful discussion of what constitutes a code violation, how one reports a violation to the County and how the violation is investigated. I relayed all of the complaints I received to the County and they com-

Second, we will be discussing the plans for expansion of the existing Army National Guard Readiness Center (ARNGRC), parking facilities, and other supporting facilities to accommodate the 1200 personnel who will be vacating government-leased space in accordance with the Base Realignment Enclosure (BRAC)

Recommendations. We will discuss the potential impact to the neighborhood. We also would like to determine at this meeting what the position of the BSCL is regarding the plans for expansion, specifically what facets of the expansion we support and what facets we do not support, so that we can relay the BSCL's feedback to the County.

At the last meeting we were joined by the Arlington County Code Enforcement officers for a useful discussion of what constitutes a code violation, how one reports a violation to the County and how the violation is investigated. I relayed all of the complaints I received to the County and they commenced the investigations. Due to legal reasons, however, the County cannot relay the progress of an investigation to anyone except the person submitting the report. Thus, I encourage you all to check with the Code Enforcement office at 703-228-3232 to add yourself as a complainant and obtain the status of the investigation.

National Diabetes Walk in Barcroft

You probably saw them out your window or perhaps you joined them on the route...

Barcroft Elementary School gathered their students, staff, families and neighbors for their third annual 5K School Walk for Diabetes, an event of the American Diabetes Association, on Sat, March 8, 2008 at 9 a.m.

Students and teachers of Barcroft are worked together to raise funds to support the important research, information and advocacy efforts of the American Diabetes Association. Approximately 20.8 million children and adults have diabetes in United States, and one in three babies born today will develop diabetes in their lifetime.

Not only did students raise funds, but they are also actively learned life-long lessons about the seriousness of diabetes and how eating healthy and exercising can help prevent the disease. The school received a percentage of the funds raised for the American Diabetes Association back to purchase needed physical education equipment and school medical supplies.

"We are so excited to participate in School Walk for Diabetes," said Carmen Dunlap. "It is a chance for us to make a difference in our community and at the same time raise money for an important cause." The idea for the walk was developed by the students after learning about a Barcroft parent who developed diabetes as an adolescent.





The two species available this year are native trees highly recommended for this area. The Allegheny Serviceberry (Amelanchier Laevis) is a small flowering tree (15-25 ft) with year-round interest and high wildlife value. It prefers part sun to shade and can tolerate a moist location. 
The Yellow Poplar/Tulip Poplar (Liriodendron tulipifera) is a fast-growing large canopy tree (70-100 ft) also with high wildlife value. It prefers a full to part sun location. View it at: http://www.ces.ncsu.edu/depts/hort/consumer/factsheets/trees-new/liriodendron tulipifera.html

The trees will be delivered in one-two gallon containers and their height should range between three and five feet. This is a good size for transplanting and future growth success, and is small enough to handle with ease.

Trees will be available for pickup from the Barcroft community house on Saturday May 10th. County Tree Stewards will also be on hand to give a planting demonstration, and will provide detailed instructions, maintenance tips, and general guidance.

Don't miss out on this great chance to get highly recommended trees for your yard at the same time that you are helping to replenish Barcroft's declining tree canopy.

\$729,750 is the New Maximum Loan!

On 3/6/08 FHA, Fannie Mae, and Freddie Mac announced that higher loan limits set by the economic stimulus bill. FNMA and FHLMC will only purchase jumbo-conforming mortgages originated through 12/31/08. Mortgage lenders will assist customers with implementation by providing reference materials including an online loan limit reference tool and guidance on our loan limits based on a property's geography.
