The Conservation Plan sets the neighborhood's priorities for receiving County funding for projects like fixing sidewalks, lighting, beautification, etc. It has been a long process over the past two years to survey neighbors, tabulate the results and write up the Plan. Many thanks go Randy and Barbara Swart for spearheading the effort, as well as all the neighbors who volunteered on committees or as block captains. The County Board commended our Plan as a model for others to emulate, a true community effort!

At our last community meeting, we heard from our police captain and her officers for a **crime** **update**. Please be careful during the holiday season if you are headed out of town. The County recommends having a neighbor set out your trash, arrange to have your newspapers and mail stopped, put a couple of lights and maybe also a radio or TV on timers, and remove any valuables if you are leaving (and lock!) your car.

Historic Recipe

Some years ago, Barbara Swart orchestrated the production of a wonderful *Barcroft Cookbook* filled with recipes submitted by neighbors. All proceeds went to help restore the Community House.

Try this side dish and be a part of Barcroft history!

Sweet Potato Honey Balls

This recipe come from Adeline Marye Robertson, who was born and raised in Barcroft. Her family, the Maryes, were one of the orginal Barcroft familes. Her father, Sydney, edited the 1903 Barcroft News.

3 or 4 medium size sweet potatoes 2 Tbs butter 1 Tbs. cinnamon 1/2 cup honey 1/4/ tsp. salt 1 lb shelled pecans, crushed

Bake sweet potatoes. Remove skins. Mash with butter, salt and cinnamon. When cool, make into small balls. Cool overnight. Dribble each with a little honey. Roll each into crush pecans (with a little butter.) Makes about 12-15 balls. These can be prepared days in advance, then heated thoroughly before serving. welcome . nurture . serve . proclaim


