Real Estate Market Trends

The Northern Virginia Association of Realtors® reports on <u>July 2009 home sales</u> activity for Fairfax and Arlington counties, the cities of Alexandria, Fairfax and Falls Church and the towns of Vienna, Herndon and Clifton.

A total of 2,053 homes sold in July 2009, a 10.55 percent increase above July 2008 home sales of 1.857.

Active listings decreased by 25.62% from last year, with 7,439 active listings in July, compared with 10,002 homes available in July 2008.

The average days on market (DOM) for homes in July 2009 decreased by 31.87% to 62 days, compared with 91 days in July 2008. Sales prices continue to remain lower than those realized last year.

The average sales price in July fell by 5%from July 2008, to \$460,807, compared with last July's average of \$485,225.

The number of pending home sales in Northern Virginia in July shows an increase of 10.21 % at 2,266 compared to 2,056 in July 2008.

Consumer confidence has improved and home sales have definitely picked up this year. Most of the activity involves first time buyers snapping up bargain-priced properties, especially in the lower price ranges..

President's Report

The summer has flown by one more time, and the BSCL begins meeting again on **Thursday**, **September 3rd at 7:30 PM at the Barcroft Community House.** Because Labor Day falls on the 7th, we hope to catch you all before you leave for the long weekend out of town!

The meeting on the 3rd will feature reports on the renewal of the Demeter House use permit, and on the work being done on the track at the Barcroft School. The meeting will also feature a presentation by Andrea Morris, the Arlington County "Base Realignment and Closure" Coordinator on the construction that continues on the National Guard Bureau and State Department facilities on George Mason Drive. The BSCL and the Alcova Heights Civic Association are working together (with Arlington County staff) to monitor the current parking impact on nearby streets and other long term impacts, and on the plans to accommodate the significant growth coming our way. I hope you'll be able to join us.

This was a busy summer for Barcroft neighborhood concerns. The Arlington County planning staff began work on the "Columbia Pike Housing Study", and have hosted several meetings with representatives from civic associations along the Pike, as well as other stakeholders, to consider how our community would like to see the multi-family housing locations along the Pike "redevelop" in the decades

to come. This study is a follow-up to the Columbia Pike initiative and form based code planning work done in the 2002-2003 timeframe. Because this planning work will have an important impact on how our neighborhoods evolve, and how affordable housing options change, there will be much more to follow on this important planning effort.

In July the Arlington County Board accepted the Neighborhood Conservation Advisory Committee's proposed funding for improvements to the Four Mile Run trail at Columbia Pike. This proposal was the result of hard work by a BSCL committee focused on making this highly visible stretch of the trail and green space safer and more accessible for a variety of uses. It is gratifying to note that the Board affirmed this hard work over an objection from another Arlington neighborhood representative who challenged the design efforts of our Barcroft neighbors. Thanks for your hard work!

Finally, congratulations to **Andrew Hunter** for another wonderful July 4th parade, and to all those who made the festivities that followed a big success!

County Tree Stewards are embarking on a new program of Public outreach.


On **Sunday October 18th** you are invited to a free walk and talk on all things trees from 3 – 4pm. This walk is open to the general public. Please meet at 3pm in front of the Barcroft community house on the corner of Buchannan and South 8th streets, Arlington 22204. Walking required will be minimal.

We'll show you examples of planting the right tree in the right place, and discuss for example what trees are appropriate for planting under power lines? How close to my house or to the street can I plant my tree? Will tree roots damage my home's foundation?

We'll show examples in the close-by neighborhood and share information such as: Why mulch around trees, and how much mulch is the right amount? Should I choose a native or non-native tree? How much water does my newly planted tree versus my established mature tree need? How trees can save you money on your air conditioning bill.

Especially if you moved here in 1938 as did Bill Molloy.

Bill arrived here just after he graduated from high school. For many years, he and his wife, Margaret, made their home on 5th Street south. Later they moved over to 8th Street South, near Barcroft School. Their son, Bill Jr, attended Barcroft, Kenmore and Wakefield. Bill remembers that he couldn't understand what the School Board was thinking. First they decided to make Barcroft school have "open classrooms." Many of the interior walls were removed. Then the school board turned around and decided that the walls were necessary after all!

The Mollovs were very active in the community and with Arlington Forest United Methodist Church. Bill helped out with a Boy Scout troop as well.

Bill remembers the land where the Women's Club was built. He also remembers the house that was torn down where Bob and Edith's restaurant recently closed. He was not a fan of the installation of

speed bumps in the neighborhood.

In 2007 Margaret died. This past May, Bill, now age 91, moved to the Greenspring Retirement Village in Springfield,

Thank you to the Molloys and so many other longtime neighbors for helping to make Barcroft a special place to live!

The County Board recently approved \$3.3 million in funding for nine neighborhood conservation projects, including one in Barcroft.

For the W&OD Trail and Glencarlyn Park at Columbia Pike, a \$468,000 park enhancement project will include the addition of a rain garden with native plants, game tables, and other play elements.

Many thanks to Barcrofter Shirley Gay and other Park Committee members for all the work they did to make this happen, and to our BSCL President, Bryant Monroe for representing Barcroft at the County Board meeting.

Around Town

County Awards Contract for Streetscape Engineering and Streetcar Planning

Arlington County Board recently approved a contract award to provide transportation engineering services for the Columbia Pike Multimodal Improvement Project. The contract will entail preliminary environmental documentation and design planning for the entire length of Columbia Pike from the Fairfax County line to S. Joyce St.

The multimodal roadway design will accommodate and be coordinated with the implementation of the planned Columbia Pike streetcar. Over the next two years, Arlington and Fairfax Counties will continue to examine ways to fund, construct, operate and maintain the proposed streetcar system.

The environmental documentation is expected to meet both state requirements and federal requirements under the National Environmental Policy Act, which in turn will allow the streetcar project to qualify for federal funding, if available. The study will also more accurately estimate the streetcar's construction costs.
