At its November 14 meeting, the Arlington County Board will consider the Arlington Partnership for Affordable Housing (APAH) application to acquire and refurbish the Buchanan Gardens apartments (located near the Pike on Buchanan Street). APAH is requesting that the County provide financial assistance and approve a "Use Permit" that will enable the project to proceed. As many of you know the BSCL has passed two resolutions supporting this project, and our neighborhood conservation plan encourages improvements to this site. The County

Manager and staff support this project and have recommended the Board approve the APAH request. APAH staff have been regular visitors to BSCL meetings, and we look forward to continuing this very positive relationship.

I know many Barcroft neighbors are very concerned about the impact of the expansion of the National Guard Bureau and the State Department training facility located at the corner of Route 50 and George Mason Drive. The BSCL is looking for volunteer members and a chairperson for our neighborhood traffic committee, and parking/safety issues tied to this growth would be a high priority for the committee. Please consider lending a hand and help the BSCL assume a leadership role as we grapple with this very significant challenge for our community. Blankets for Babies: Do you knit or crochet?

just sex months on the Board, she is starting a new program to provide each baby and child entering a shelter with his or her very own hand-made blanket.

Jo Anne has lived in the same house in Barcroft since 1981. She has been crocheting since she was 6 years old when she learned from her grandmother. She says: "I am always working on some crochet project. When my husband and I watch TV, I "multi-task" by crocheting."

Since she always has a project going, it occurred to Jo Anne that other Barcrofters might be similarly engaged and willing to donate their stitching skills to this wonderful cause.

She got the idea for blankets for babies because she had crocheted several baby blankets for her son when he was little. He's now 21 years old! He loved his blankets and carefully laid them out on his

bedcovers every night for years! When he was in high school, they remodeled his bedroom. He asked his mom to be sure if she had his baby blankets in a safe place. Since the blankets provided such a sense of security and feeling of home for her own son, Jo Anne wanted to bring those same feelings to little children whose families are going through difficult times -- to make the children feel safe and warm -- a feeling of home even when their families are without a permanent place to call home.

If you're interested in keeping your fingers busy on the soon-to-be-here chilly nights, Jo Anne will provide the yarn if you will do the stitching! Use any pattern you want and work at your own pace. Remember, these are for children, so they don't have to be full-size afghans.

Your loving handwork will provide some much needed security and comfort to homeless children

BSCL MEMBERSHIP DUES To Rise

Condolences to the family of Barcrofter **Jack Reed** who died suddenly in November of a heart attack. He and wife **Barbara Clemens** have been longtime Barcrofters. He had recently stood by her side helping her through her bout with cancer. Jack loved the neighborhood.

In addition to BSCL activities, Jack was an active ham radio operator and President of the Arlington Amateur Radio Club. He was a staunch supporter of Arlington CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) and The American Red Cross.

Barbara's lament: "This is so very unfair to Jack. He held everything together during my nine months of cancer treatments. He never wavered. We were ready for a cancer-free future. He doesn't deserve this."

The former George Mason Shell station at the corner of Columbia Pike and George Mason Drive is finally reopening as: The Car Place at Barcroft: George Mason Service Center. Mr. Ishar Ahmed is still the owner/operator only now he will be independent and able to buy gas from Shell, Sunoco, or whomever has the best prices. His shop has been totally rehabbed, his underground gas tanks are environmentally up to date, and his pumps are brand new. He and his crew are anxious to get back to work as this process dragged on much longer than expected. For example, they ran into unmarked sewer lines from the 1930's that had to be relocated around the station. • County Board Approves \$7.1 million for Buchanan Gardens Apartments

- 111 garden apartments to be improved, enlarged, kept affordable for 60 years
- Project is part of County's effort toward affordable housing around Columbia Pike
- County expects further funding request from APAH to renovate units
- The property now offers 82-one bedroom units, 28 two-bedroom units and a single three-bedroom unit at affordable rents. None of the units are accessible to persons with disabilities. Rents range from \$835 to \$1,395 a month.

Tax Credit Extension Update

On 11/6/09 President Obama signed a bill into law extending the \$8,000 tax credit to first-time home buyers. The temporary credit is only available for purchases that go to contract before 5/1/2010 and that close before 7/1/2009. The tax credit has greatly helped to stabilize the housing market, and could make a larger impact by including more home buyers.

This new law also includes a tax credit for home buyers who "move up" or "trade-in" their home. Under the new bill, home buyers who are have lived in their home for at least five concurrent years over the past eight years, and purchase a new home, are eligible for a \$6,500 tax credit. The new house does not have to cost more than the original home. Also, the credit is available for home buyers who once owned a home (and lived there for at least five concurrent years over the past eight years), but have since sold it and have been renting.

The income limits are now \$125,000 per year for individuals and \$225,000 for married couples. Maximum house price is of \$800,000. Congress recently passed legislation to extend a temporary increase for "conforming loans" that mortgage financiers Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac may buy from lenders to \$729,750 through the end of next year. Those limits would have reverted to \$625,500 on 1/1/2010. Lawmakers approved the increase to avoid disrupting the mortgage market.
