Tax Credit Extension Update

On 11/6/09 President Obama signed a bill into law extending the \$8,000 tax credit to first-time home buyers. The temporary credit is only available for purchases that go to contract before 5/1/2010 and that close before 7/1/2009. The tax credit has greatly helped to stabilize the housing market, and could make a larger impact by including more home buyers.

This new law also includes a tax credit for home buyers who "move up" or "trade-in" their home. Under the new bill, home buyers who are have lived in their home for at least five concurrent years over the past eight years, and purchase a new home, are eligible for a \$6,500 tax credit. The new house does not have to cost more than the original home. Also, the credit is available for home buyers who once owned a home (and lived there for at least five concurrent years over the past eight years), but have since sold it and have been renting.

The income limits are now \$125,000 per year for individuals and \$225,000 for married couples. Maximum house price is of \$800,000. Congress recently passed legislation to extend a temporary increase for "conforming loans" that mortgage financiers Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac may buy from lenders to \$729,750 through the end of next year. Those limits would have reverted to \$625,500 on 1/1/2010. Lawmakers approved the increase to avoid disrupting the mortgage market.

We start the New Year with a **meeting on**January 7 that will feature a special presentation on the Columbia Pike Land Use and Housing Study. Many of these properties will evolve in the years to come, and it is our hope that the community can have a voice in how those changes occur.

Jennifer Smith of the Arlington County Planning Division will brief us on the study and its' impact on Barcroft, and she'll walk us through the planning process. Of particular interest will be how you can be involved, and put your opinions into the mix. For some great maps

Update on Arlington Mill Bv Heidi Wicker

On December 15, the Arlington County Board unanimously authorized the County to move ahead with the public portion of the approved plan for a new Arlington Mill Com- of the Steering Committee members munity Center, including the community center, plaza and gymnasium, with the goal to begin building as soon as possible. The residential component of the project will be built separately when the County finds a development partner for that portion.

Arlington Mill on Columbia Pike has been closed for about 15 months. A plan for redeveloping the site into a mixed use area with a community center, gymnasium, classroom space, retail and both market rate and affordable housing, in a public-private partnership, was approved by the County Board and a bond for the project approved by voters in 2006. Unfortunately, due to market conditions, the County has been unable to find a commercial development partner for the market-rate apartment portion of the approved plan.

a public meeting was held December 3. **First** was to tear down the existing structure, create recreational sports fields on the site and wait 5 years before building the approved plan. **Second** was to reoccupy the existing structure which would take about 18 months due to building maintenance and then wait 5 years before building the approved plan. Third, which was approved by the Board, is to split the plan into two phases: 1) build the public portion as soon as possible and 2) build the

residential component, to be located behind the community center, whenever a development partner is found.

On December 7, the County Board and most (including Barcroft) expressed support for the phased approach because it is more certain to result in a new community center that would be built faster (3 years).

The County Board stated that the County should push forward with both phases at the same time, if possible. So, if a development partner is found for the residential component of the plan, the residential building could be built at the same time as the public portion.

The only modifications to the approved plan anticipated to implement the Phased Approach are elimination of the parking garage underneath the Community Center (parking would be added on other portions of the site instead) and possibly the housing intended to be in the public building. Regarding the residential building, the Board asked that if they cannot find a commercial development part-Three options were proposed and discussed at ner to build the residential building, one option is for the residential building to be all affordable housing.

> It is exciting that the County is finally moving forward with this project, which was over 10 years in the making. There will be additional opportunities for Barcroft input as the project moves forward, so stay tuned.
