DONATE TO RENOVATE! Barcroft Community House RESTORATION: Stage Two



The Barcroft School and Civic League (BSCL) needs your help to raise \$40,000. In the second phase of Community House restoration, the interior of the Community House will be renovated to increase energy efficiency and aesthetic charm. The BSCL will hire a contractor to complete the following projects:

- 1. Raise the Ceiling in the Main Hall: The current ceiling will be raised and replaced with a wooden beadboard ceiling. New electrical wiring will be installed, ceiling fans with light fixtures will replace the old lights, and all surfaces will be painted.
- 2. Replace Wall in the Main Hall: The current wall surfaces will be replaced with moldand moisture-resistant drywall. New electrical wiring will be installed to support additional stage lighting, and the walls will be insulated.
- 3. Insulate the Kitchen and Stage Attic: All exposed ductwork and the ceiling will be insulated to make the Community House GREENER!

We are well on our way to our goal of \$40,000!!

\$20,000 will be used immediately to pay the estimated construction costs, and the remaining \$20,000 will recapitalize the reserve to offset any maintenance emergencies or unanticipated construction costs.

New History of Barcroft —Online

Randy Swart reported that we have a new history of our Barcroft neighborhood on the BSCL Web site:

Elizabeth Walter wrote this Barcroft history as her thesis. She has revised it since and has permitted us to post it on the BSCL Web page. It is a truly remarkable document, titled "Barcroft: The Beginnings of a Suburban Neighborhood (1886 to 1920), Revised."

Elizabeth is the sister of **Anna Peterson**. **Anna and Scott** live in one of Barcroft's most historic houses, the inspiration for the history. Here is an excerpt from page 6:

The future site of Barcroft, the land adjacent to Columbia Pike and next to an existing railroad station, was undoubtedly handy. It was also well situated on the high ground above the road, wooded, and amply watered. Four Mile Run flowed on its western edge, Doctor's Branch on its eastern, and an unnamed stream flowed from a spring between these two. The spring was known locally as the Dolly Madison Spring, from stories that she had liked to stop there when riding through this part of the countryside There was also a creek running east-west across the property. (written in the late 1800s)
