## **BSCL President's Report**

The BSCL New Year got off to a busy start at our January meeting with guests from Arlington County, Captain Michelle R. Nuneville (Commander Arlington County Police Department Operations Division - District 3) and Fire Department **Lt. Gregg Karl.** While Assistant Chief Barksdale was unable to attend the meeting, Lt. Karl answered questions about the house burning on 8th Street South. Lt. Karl lives in Barcroft and we appreciate his participation at the meeting!

Barcroft neighbors remain upset and concerned by the house burning. We are pressing for answers and a change to Arlington's policy on burning vacant houses as a training opportunity for our fire fighters. It was agreed that the BSCL would pursue several actions on this issue. First, a committee chaired by Scott Brinitzer will assemble to monitor progress on the demolition of the burned house (which is quite a dangerous eyesore) and changes to the County's policy. Second, a letter will be sent to the developer requesting confirmation that the house be demolished as soon as possible. Third, BSCL will invite the Fire Department Chief to attend a future BSCL meeting (possibly March, subject to confirmation). **Randy Swart** arranged to have a representative from the Arlington Civic Federation in attendance who said that the Federation would also be following up with the County to advocate dropping this approach to training. Police Captain Nuneville and her staff spoke in the second half of the meeting, and provided an update on crime in Barcroft. The crime statistics showed a decrease in crime since her visit last year. She offered tips on staying safe and protecting our homes and vehicles. Barcroft is very fortunate to have her and the community policing team working on our behalf.

The February BSCL meeting on Feb. 3 will include the Alcova Heights Civic Association. We will focus on the growth at the National Guard Bureau and State Department facilities at George Mason Drive and Rt. 50. As we know, this has made parking difficult in parts of our neighborhood. National Guard, State Department and County staff will discuss the current status of the expansion project and concerns and questions from Barcroft and Alcova Heights neighbors.

A final note, I am seeking a Barcroft volunteer for membership on Board of Directors for the Columbia Pike Revitalization Organization (CPRO). I have served several terms, and will need to leave the Board. It is a great group of civic and business leaders working to make the

Pike a better place. Please let me know

Did you really appreciate your dinner last night? Did you feel like you could afford pretty much whatever you wanted the last time

you went food shopping? If you are like most of us, eating a nutritious meal and having the ability to purchase the food you and your family want and like are things you take for granted.

As volunteers for Food for Others, a Northern Virginia foodbank, **Jim Duffey**, Mary McBride, my husband, **Cliff**, and I have learned to love and value what we have. Each Monday afternoon, one of us picks up a carload of food and brings it to two locations near Barcroft. Usually, two of us distribute at two sites, one near Columbia Commons Apartments and the other at the recycling lot on Columbia Pike. The whole job takes no more than two and a half hours. To receive food, folks need no referral. This makes the food more accessible for some than AFAC (Arlington Food Assistance Center.) Recipients are almost unbelievably appreciative.

After distributing for many, many years, Jim, Cliff and I now have health constraints which make this work more and more challenging. We'd love to help you learn the ropes. Interested? # Fox Sightings Around the Neighborhood

Foxes have been quite a hot topic in the BSCL chat email list (To join, visit www.bscl.org/ chatlist.htm)

On Jan. 5. a neighbor walking his English sheep dog noticed a fox was closely following them. He turned and yelled at it, but the fox just kept following, barking now and then. Frightened, he knocked on the door of **Sue Tenenbaum** who kindly offered to drive him home. Whew. Other neighbors report sightings at all times of day and hearing yelping at night.

Neighbors have been both frightened and fascinated by foxes in the past. In February, 2009, **Carol Harvey** wrote a great article for the Barcroft News. Here are some excerpts:

"Several Barcroft dog walkers report being charged by a large red fox. Is it rabid? No, it's probably looking for love. Alonso Abugattas at Long Branch Nature Center, says that this is mating season. The foxes have raging hormones and are "a little crazy" right now. They are territorial and an approaching dog is 1) a potential mate or 2) a competitor for mates and/or territory. A fox wants the dog to know that it is the owner of the territory and will show off to scare others away. The fox is probably totally focused on the dog and not the human attached to it. Foxes are normally shy, but raging hormones can cause them to act abnormally. They are yelping in the woods at night, and should come back to their senses in a few weeks

The fox will rarely come in physical contact with others. If it charges, make loud noises

and wave your arms to scare it off. **If it actually tries to bite, call Animal Control at 703-931-9241.**" For more info, contact Alonso at the Nature Center 703-228-6535.

I spoke with Alonso who thinks January is rather early for a fox to begin the mating season. However, he says that, just like humans, and, er, some of our neighbors, some foxes are just a bit wacky. For example, **Chris Gagliana** who writes:

"I hope they get to stay in the neighborhood - I'd much rather have a fox problem than a rat problem. ...Foxes do eat mice and rats. [Alonso says they also eat squirrels.] But I really find it humorous that a fox was trailing an English sheep dog, especially if it's the full grown sheepdog I've seen around Barcroft a few times. As a former male teenager myself, (I should clarify - I'm still male, just not a teenager!) I'm well aware that hormones can make a guy do stupid things. More power to the fox if he could pull that mating ritual off, but I have to wonder if the fox didn't have his beer goggles on that night."

## Kale Chip Recipe

What?? Sounds weird but these are great. Fresh kale is very inexpensive at Food Star! Make this with your kids.

#### KALE CHIPS

Heat oven to 300 degrees.

Lightly spray a couple of nonstick baking sheets with oil or use parchment paper.

1 small bunch kale, washed and patted dry Remove the fattest part of the veins and cut leaves into pieces, not too small. Put in a large bowl.

In a small bowl mix together:

1 Tablespoon olive oil

1-2 Tablespoons lemon juice

1-2 Tablespoons nutritional yeast flakes (the secret ingredient! It's inactive, not like bread yeast. Gives a cheesy flavor. Available at natural foods stores).

Pour over the kale. Mix with hands and spread in one layer on baking sheets. Bake 30 minutes. Remove to bowl right out of the oven.

#### Will mortgage rates go back down?

And when you include the stimulative action of extending the present tax rates and adding further cuts, it's tough to see Bonds or home loan rates improving much.
