Around The Neighborhood with Kathy Kerr

Something wonderful is always blossoming at **Bonnie Cobos'** house on 8th St. S. One August morning I was lucky to have a tour of her beautiful yard and home.

In the early 1990's Bonnie saw some orchids hanging in bags on the wall at Merrifield Garden Center. She had no idea what to do with them but thought it would be interesting to see what might happen. Her fascination for orchids has

only increased. Growing them just for fun, she now has dozens of orchids—all shapes, sizes and colors. Some are inside the house, some are outdoors during the summer under a grape arbor and others are protected in the backyard greenhouse. She says

the best time for lots of blooms is Spring and Fall. Most orchids will bloom at the same time each year, but it varies for each plant category.

I asked about dormant orchids because in my limited experience, sometimes they bloom for awhile and then just look dead. She says if they are green, they are alive. Brown, dead parts can be removed.

Bonnie's green thumb is also apparent in their yard. They have many beautiful plants and trees, quite a few bearing edible fruits such as blueberries, kiwis, persimmons, apples, pears, pawpaws and even "Egyptian walking onions." I have never seen a northern kiwi tree before. The fruit does not have the fuzzy shell as seen in the grocery store, but Bonnie says when the fruit is cut in half, it becomes recognizable.

Bonnie's husband, **Bolivar**, was born in Ecuador but moved to the USA in 1954. He earned his Masters degree in economics. He worked for the Inter-American Development Bank and they spent 12 years in Latin America. In 1985, they returned to Arlington and spent 5 months searching

for the right home to buy.

One day, while driving through Barcroft, they noticed some people moving out of a house on 8th St. S. They asked if the house might be for sale. Turns out that these were renters who

had no idea. The Cobos then went to the Court House to find the name of the owner to see if the house might be for sale. It was and they bought it. Later, their hardworking real estate agent called to say that she had found the perfect house for them and that it would be going on the market soon! The Cobos had to tell her that they had already purchased that same house.

The Cobos currently have 3 daughters, 7 grandsons and 2 granddaughters.

Bonnie is active with the National Capitol Orchid Society. Members meet to share information and plants. The annual orchid show and sale held at the National Arboretum will be Oct. 8-10 and is one of the best on the East Coast.

Emergency Preparedness and Response Training Offered

What do floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, blizzards, building collapses, terrorist attacks, fires and hazmat situations have in common? They have all occurred in Arlington County within the past ten years. And they all illustrate the importance of being personally prepared for and able to respond to emergencies, large and small. It's everyone's responsibility.

That's what Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training is all about. This 8-session, 25-hour course, sponsored by the Arlington County Citizen Corps Council, Office of Emergency Management and Fire Department, covers disaster preparedness, disaster medical operations, light search and rescue, team organization, disaster psychology, fire suppression and terrorism. It follows a FEMA/DHS all-hazards curriculum being used around the globe.

To date, over 500 individuals have completed CERT training in Arlington County. It is open to Arlington residents – and those who work in the County but reside elsewhere -- who are at least 18 years of age (16 if accompanied by at least one parent) and able to participate in all aspects of the training, some of which requires lifting and carrying. The training is free, but participants are expected to acquire certain supplies themselves, many of which you probably already have on-hand. All

classes meet at the Arlington County Fire Department Training Academy in Shirlington.

Some complete this training simply to be safer in their own homes and workplaces. Others choose to complete additional requirements necessary to become active members of neighborhood teams trained to assist in major disasters. All help make Arlington County a safer place to live, work and play!

Northern Virginia Market Trends

The Northern Virginia Association of Realtors® reports on March 2011 home sales activity for Fairfax and Arlington counties, the cities of Alexandria, Fairfax and Falls Church and the towns of Vienna, Herndon and Clifton.

A total of 1,437 homes sold in March 2011, a 7.71% decrease below March 2010 home sales of 1,557. Active listings decreased by 7% from 2010, with 3,975 active listings in 3/11, compared with 4,267 homes available in 3/10. The average days on market (DOM) for homes in 3/11 increased 39% to 71 days, compared with 51 days in 3/10. Sale prices rose compared with those realized last year. The average sales price in March 2011 increased 3% from March 2010, to \$448,957 from \$434,129 last March.

Arlington County Statistics comparing March 2010 to 2011: Condos - Avg. Sold Price was \$373,112 in 3/10 - up 13% in 3/11 to \$421,108. Single Family Attached - Avg. Sold Price was \$551,911 in 3/10 - up 18% to \$653,160 in 3/11. Single Family Detached - Avg. Sold Price \$712,483 in 3/10, up 3% to \$732,041 in 3/11. On 10/1/11 the current administration is proposing lowering the conforming loan amount from \$729,750 to \$625,500 for FHA, Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac housing loans.
