At the April meeting Michael Nazaretz was elected to fill the Executive Committee position term left vacant when Dave Peacefull moved away. Congratulations to Michael and thanks for this commitment. Michael has also joined with the team of Randy and Barbara Swart, Jim Kerr, Michael Behringer and others who are working on constantly improving the condition of the Community House and grounds.

The May regular monthly meeting will be held at 7:30 pm on Thurs., May 3. We will then be on hiatus until the September 6th meeting begins our new year. Of course we will enjoy the Garden Tour on May 20, the 4th of July Parade and the August 7 National Night Ice Cream Social in between!!

At the May 3 meeting we will say thanks to **Gary** and **Peg** Lefebvre for their many years of service to BSCL as they move to their new home not too far away. We will hold the election of officers to fill their seats and others. We are still seeking a candidate for the Recording Secretary position. Fay Cheung has accepted appointment to position of Membership Coordinator.

We will have a presentation by Jeremy Watson of Arlington County staff on planned improvements to S. George Mason Drive. In 2010, the County Board approved an increase in the vehicle decal fee from \$25 to \$33. Revenue from the twelve dollar increase is dedicated for the design and implementation of transportation improvement projects. Three projects were completed in FY 2010 and three more have been programmed for FY 2012. One of which is. S. George Mason Drive.

The project limits are between Arlington Boulevard and Columbia Pike. Most, if not all the improvements, are aimed at creating a safer environment for pedestrians, transit riders, and bicyclists. The project will relocate the crosswalk at Arlington Boulevard and install new pedestrian ramps. Curb extensions and/or bus nubs are being proposed at the crosswalk in-front of the Army National Guard Center, at the 4th St intersection, and at the 6th St intersection. A pedestrian signal has also been proposed in front of the Army National Guard Center. Lastly, "sharrows" will be installed on both sides along the entire stretch. "Sharrows" are shared-lane markings painted on the street. The project is funded for design and construction, which is scheduled to begin this summer.

We are hopeful that State Delegate Patrick Hope will stop by the deliver a brief update on this year's session of the legislature.

Farewell to Peggy and Gary Lefebvre

If you have ever gone to any event at the Barcroft Community House, then you have likely met Gary and Peg Lefebvre. For events with admission, they are most often seen near the door greeting everyone with friendly smiles while collecting money. This is handy because Gary has served as the BSCL treasurer since 1998. Two years before that, Peg became the BSCL membership chair and also maintains the database for BSCL donations.

They are moving this fall to The Woodlands retirement community in Fairfax.

Peg was born and raised in Chicago. She got involved with computers in 1960, back when one computer took up an entire room. She worked for the Veterans Administration and moved to Austin Texas when they opened a new computer there. She then moved to Alexandria in 1969 still working for the VA. Her boss, **Gerry Quinlan**, lived here in Barcroft. In 1971, Gerry's wife, **Gloria**, noticed a townhouse near them was for sale on George Mason Dr. and they helped Peg to buy it.

Meanwhile, Gary, via St Paul, MN and Louisiana, was serving in the Navy. He came to the DC area in 1975 and met Peg. In 1978 Gary was posted to Iceland for a year. When he came back, they set a wedding date and were married in 1980 at Holy Trinity Catholic church in Georgetown where they are still active members. They moved into their house at 812 S. George

Mason Drive in 1981.

Gary has served for many years as treasurer for the American Legion here in Arlington and also for the German-American Society (even though it's Peg who is part German, not Gary!)

Gary and Peg have two stepsons, one in Centerville and one in New York, four grandchildren, two in Centerville and two in Alaska and four great grandchildren, all in Alaska.

One of Gary's favorite Barcroft stories goes back to 2004. Tom Palance lived here and is a fabulous Navy Band trumpet player. As Tom transformed the Barcroft Marching Band for the 4th of July parade, he discovered that Gary used to play the tuba! Back in 1956, Gary was in fact going to audition for the Navy band, but it was just weeks before the end of the GI bill, so he waived his audition. He went to electronics school and found quite a few other musicians who had made the same choice. They formed a band that even did some traveling. But when he transferred to a destroyer, there was no more music. 48 years later, Tom Palance found a tuba and talked Gary into playing for the BSCL parade.

Barcroft will never be the same with Peg and Gary! We all wish them the best as they downsize and move away—but they will be close enough to come back to Barcroft any time!
