10 AM -- Participants assemble on their block with their Block Captains to form a MINI PARADE to the Barcroft Community House, 8th St S. and S. Buchanan.

Upon arrival at the Barcroft Community House the Mini Parade will join the Barcroft Main Parade.

11 AM -- The Barcroft Neighborhood Parade will begin. The parade route will run one block south on Buchanan, turn left on 8th Road South, then left again on Wakefield to Barcroft School. The judges reviewing stand will be in front of Barcroft School. If the school can open for us the remaining festivities will be there; otherwise we will continue the parade back to the Barcroft Community House.



SOME STREETS WILL BE BLOCKED OFF FOR THE PARADE FROM 10 AM TO NOON

Arlington County Police will put barricades up on Buchanan from 7th St. to 8th Road, on 8th Road from Buchanan to Wakefield, and on Wakefield from 8th Road to Barcroft School. Call Anne Noll at 892-6710 if you have any questions.
