October 5th Meeting:

DRUGS IN ARLINGTON: WHO, WHAT, WHERE, AND HOW TO PROTECT YOUR CHILDREN

Our October 5th meeting at the Barcroft Community House, 800 South Buchanan, will begin promptly at 7:30. For the first half hour we will take care of BSCL business and hear from delegates to the Civic Federation, CPRO and the Neighborhood Conservation Advisory Commission about the hot issues in Arlington civic affairs. We will also vote on whether or not to have another 4th of July parade next year. At 8 PM we will begin a one-hour program on drug and alcohol abuse. Lt. Karinshak of the Arlington County Police Department will explain what Arlington's drug problem is, where it is, and how to know when someone is using drugs in your neighborhood. Then a speaker from the Washington Area Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse will cover "What Every Parent Should Know About Drugs," and how to persuade a child not to use drugs. At 9 we will have refreshments.

As an added incentive, you can bring anything you want to donate to the BSCL flea market to the meeting. See page 3 for an article about the flea market.

BARCROFT ASKS CHANGE IN COLUMBIA PIKE REVITALIZATION ORGANIZATION STUDY

Some months ago a CPRO committee began a market study of Columbia Pike. They prepared plans for four sites to suggest how change along the Pike might be channeled. Three of the four sites were for large new buildings at Walter Reed Drive. The fourth was at George Mason Drive, to expand the Food Star.

After examining the plans, seven civic association presidents along Columbia Pike wrote a joint letter to the CPRO committee chairman asking that the plans be scrapped and that CPRO return to its original concept of promoting revitalization all along The Pike rather than denser, large scale redevelopment. Randy Swart signed the letter on behalf of the BSCL.




