The telephone in the Barcroft Community House is now reconnected, using wires that dated from the 30's. We have it hooked up to an announcing machine, the Barcroft NeighborLine. When you call 521-1116 you will get one minute of the latest in neighborhood news, yard sales, BSCL committee meetings, gossip, and more! You can call the NeighborLine to check our next meeting date, or see if a meeting is postponed for snow. It's a one minute capsule of things you want to know if you live in Barcroft. It will permit us to get the word out on the committee meetings and lost cats that take place between newsletters.

We are looking for an old-timey rotary phone like the one in this illustration to add to the announcing machine to let people call out during meetings to check with babysitters and such. (Any incoming caller during a meeting will just get the message, since we do not have a ringer on the phone.) If you have an old phone to donate, please call Randy Swart.

The machine only announces, it does not take messages. The message is changed frequently. If you have an event to list, call Randy Swart at his regular home number listed on page 2. He can change the message at the Community House from home by remote control.

The label attached has the NeighborLine number printed on it. You can stick it on the bottom of your phone or any other convenient place. Call any time, day or night, 521-1116.

BUCHANAN GARDENS TO BE RENOVATED

Arlington County Housing Division and the owner of Buchanan Gardens are in negotiations to undertake a substantial renovation of the exterior and interior of the apartment complex, which lies on the hillside behind the Barcroft shopping center.

The project will upgrade the complex while maintaining it as affordable housing. Similar to other projects the County has undertaken, the goal will be renovation without displacement. The only time people will be displaced is in the case of overcrowded units. When this occurs the County will issue the residents a voucher so they can move to a larger unit.

Funds for this project will combine the use of grants and loans, the majority from State programs. County funds will be used to encourage specific improvements approved by County Board policy in the interests of neighborhood conservation and affordable housing.

BARCROFT INTERSECTION QUALIFIES AS ONE OF THE MOST DANGEROUS IN NORTHERN VA.

The AAA has just released its annual "dangerous dozen" intersections, and the corner of Columbia Pike and George Mason Drive qualified as 11th on the list, with 27 crashes.

A Barcrofter who lives on Second Street was passing through that intersection on George Mason last spring in their brand new car and became part of that statistic when a car on Columbia Pike did not see the red light and crashed into the side of her car. Fortunately she was not permanently injured, but she was badly shaken up and their new car was damaged. The dry statistic hides 27 personal traumas like this multiplied by at least two parties involved in each case.

Looks like we may want to add something to the draft of our Neighborhood Conservation Plan requesting the County to take some action to make this intersection safer.

RECYCLING IN BARCROFT? HERE'S WHY!

Lets talk TRASH--the 1,200 pounds of trash per year that the average Barcrofter throws away. You have heard about overflowing landfills, trash in the oceans, and controversy over incinerators. What are the solutions? What can we do to help solve these problems?

Presently over 90 percent of our trash goes to generate electricity in the modern Arlington/Alexandria incinerator. The incinerator ash is 30 to 40 percent the volume of the original trash. This is deposited to the Lorton landfill, which is not expected to fill up until after the year 2000 and then can probably be extended.

So why not just throw everything into the trash can? There is one reason—our air, water, trees—our environment—the need to preserve our natural resources. It takes 8,000 trees to produce one Sunday printing of the Washington Post. Producing a ton of paper from recycled fiber saves some 3,700 pounds of trees and 24,000 gallons of water. Another important benefit from recycling the paper is that recycling reduces air pollution from paper mills by 74 percent.

Arlington has some very good recycling programs, but we still only recycle about 9% of our trash. In comparison, the Swiss recycle 50% of theirs and the Japanese do even better at 70%. Our own Arlingtonians for a Clean Environment (ACE), a private non-profit anti-litter agency, wants to boost our recycling to 50 percent through an expanded and improved curbside recycling program. ACE is now setting up recycling collection centers. So if you want to save your newspapers, aluminum cans or glass bottles and drop them off at a collection center help is coming. The County already runs three newspaper collection sites, the closest one on Columbia Pike at Four Mile Run. Look for my next article soon on recycling programs that already exist in Arlington.

BARCROFT SCHOOL HAS A NEW FLAG

On October 13 Barcroft School adopted a new school flag. Students and neighbors came out on the sunny, warm morning for the flag raising. But there were also some surprise guests!

First the Army Fife and Drum Corps marched and piped in full regalia. Then, perhaps in honor of Halloween, Dr. John W. Barcroft himself (1817-1898) returned from his grave, beard and all, to give an oral history of his life and of our neighborhood. He spoke of the Post Office which was located across from his mill on Columbia Pike. The Postmistress was so familiar with everyone's handwriting that she was able to deliver a letter addressed simply: "Mother, Barcroft, VA." Dr. Barcroft admitted to his death in 1898 but he said that his spirit still lives on at Barcroft School!

The new Barcroft School flag will be displayed daily on the flagpole underneath the Virginia flag which flies beneath the American flag.


