June 7 Meeting: COUNTY'S PROPOSED FACILITY IN BARCROFT PARK, BARCROFT SCHOOL RENOVATION, 4TH OF JULY PARADE PLANNING, TEE SHIRTS

Our June 7 meeting agenda is a full one, but the meeting will end by 9 so you can still watch Cheers.

First on the agenda will be our position on the plans for renovation of Barcroft School. This two year project is an important one for our neighborhood, and the PTA needs BSCL support for its position on what needs to be done.

Second will be a progress report on the preparations for our 4th of July Parade. You can volunteer for a spot in this fun event, which promises to be bigger and better than last year.

Third and longest will be a discussion of the County's proposal to put a "multi-program residential facility" in Barcroft Park on Four Mile Run. The facility is described in the article to the right. We will conclude by voting on a final BSCL position for the proposal.

The magnificent Barcroft neighborhood tee shirt will be on sale at the meeting. It costs only \$5, and this will be your best opportunity to buy one to wear at the 4th of July parade.

The meeting will start at 7:30 and will move right along to cover all this territory. As always, it will be at the Barcroft Community House, 800 South Buchanan Street, on the first Thursday of the month. Come and express your views on these three issues, and pick up your own neighborhood tee shirt.

COUNTY PROPOSES "RESIDENTIAL FACILITY" ON FOUR MILE RUN AT BARCROFT PARK

Arlington County wants to put a new facility on Four Mile Run Drive between George Mason and Walter Reed. It would house a corrections facility for jail inmates being returned to the community through work-release or study-release programs. It would have a detoxification facility to treat drug addicts, alcoholics and public drunks. And it would have a 48 bed shelter for the homeless. The County pledges to minimize the impact on surrounding neighborhoods by carefully controlling these three programs.

The officers and Board of the Barcroft School and Civic League studied the information on this facility and decided to oppose it. We believe that the security impact of the three programs would make Barcroft Park unusable, that other programs would eventually be located there, and that it would do permanent damage to the quality of life for all of us in our area of the County. There was an information session with County Staff on May 17th. A formal vote on a final BSCL position will be taken after discussion at our June 7th meeting.

BSCL President Randy Swart has joined with other civic association presidents to form the Coalition for the Preservation of the Four Mile Run River Valley. The Coalition held its first meeting, attended by officers of civic associations, tenants' associations and condo owners associations, on May 15th. It will protest this facility, asking the County Board to locate it in the Courthouse area where some of the functions are now located and where the County has its strongest police presence.

FOURTH OF JULY PARADE UPDATE

Were you there for the first annual Barcroft Neighborhood 4th of July parade? Then you already know how exciting it is to have your neighborhood turn out for a rousing parade, followed by a wonderful picnic. If you weren't able to come, get ready for the fun at this year's parage. Decorate your bike, put on a patriotic costume, tune up your musical instruments, or get together with your neighbors to create a float to rival last year's winners from 8th Road. There will be lots of prizes and plenty of hot dogs and drinks for everyone.

Once again we plan to have block captains throughout the neighborhood who will contact people on their blocks, collect entry forms (get those entry forms in to be eligible for prizes!) and assemble their blocks to march to the Community House on parade day. The parade will start at 11 AM and go from the Community House to Barcroft Elementary School, where the judges' reviewing stand will be, then return to the Community House for prizes to be awarded, picnicking, and music. After last year's rain, we have set an official rain date for Saturday, July 7th.

Dr. Ellen Kahan, Principal of Barcroft Elementary School, has agreed to be our Parade Grand Marshall. Arlington dignitaries Conchita Mitchell, Frank O'Leary and Al Eisenberg will be our judges. So whether you come to march or to cheer on your neighbors, this should be a great way to celebrate the 4th. Planning for the parade is going on at a great pace. FLAGS OVER SECOND STREET

Barcroft's 2nd St. S. isn't exactly a major thoroughfare but if you happen to have recently passed along that street by car, foot or bike you may have noticed an unusual flag hanging in front of one of the houses. The flag is a Lithuanian flag and is hung there daily (in good weather of course) by Tom and Sandee Radtke in support of the March 11 Lithuanian declaration of independence. Sandee says she was able to find and purchase the flag at the flag store at Union Station.

Sandee is one of perhaps 600 people in the metro area of Lithuanian descent. Her grandfather on her father's side was born in Lithuania and both of her mother's parents were born there. She grew up in a Lithuanian neighborhood in Chicago, which has the largest population of Lithuanians in the U.S.

Sandee reports that she doesn't speak Lithuanian but notes that it is a very old and very unique language not like Russian or German. She says that linguists are especially intrigued by the language as it seems to be the root of other languages.

Tom and Sandee met at Loyola University in Chicago. They have lived in Barcroft for 3 years. Tom, a former Navy officer, is graduating from GW University Law School at the end of May. He will be taking the bar soon, but in the meantime has a job with a law firm in Alexandria.

Sandee has worked as a TV producer for almost 9 years and was formerly employed by PBS Channel 56. As part of that job she was able to live in China for 3 weeks while producing a show! She is presently starting a new job involving a TV program to promote adult literacy. She says that 30% of adults in Virginia do not read above the 4th grade level and that high school graduates are expected to read only at the 8th grade level. Her project is a touch screen that interacts with the user. The program can answer questions and test skills primarily at the 4th to 8th grade level. That's about what you need to read the Barcroft News!



BARCROFT SCHOOL RENOVATION

At the June 7th BSCL meeting, members of the Barcroft School Renovations Committee will discuss the progress of the school renovation plan. preliminary architectural drawings have been completed and will be submitted to the School Board for the first time at their May 31st meeting. Members of the committee and staff from the school will be present.

The preliminary drawings have the enthusiastic support of the renovations committee. The plan maintains the historic facade of the school while adding space and updating the current building. An increase in costs was necessary to preserve the facade, and neighborhood support will be needed to justify this solution.

The School Board will take action on the plan at its next meeting on June 14th. We urge all interested persons to attend this meeting to add their support to the plan. The meeting will be at 7:30 PM on June 14th at the Education Center, 1426 N. Quincy St. (next to W&L High School).


