Our Parade Grand Marshall will be Dr. Ellen Kahan, Principal of Barcroft Elementary School.

Judges will be Al Eisenberg, Chairman of the Arlington County Board; Frank O'Leary, County Treasurer; and Conchita Mitchell, Chairman of the School Board. COUNTY DEFERS PROPOSAL FOR JAIL ON FOUR MILE RUN DRIVE, WILL STUDY FURTHER

On June 16 the County Manager withdrew his proposal to place a corrections facility, detox center and homeless shelter on Four Mile Run Drive. In his statement to the Planning Commission he said the withdrawal resulted from the settlement of a law suit with the State of Virginia under which the State will remove its prisoners from the Arlington County Jail. He emphasized that the County is more than ever convinced that the three facilities should be located together, and in response to a question he said the Four Mile Run site will continue to be considered unless there is rapid commercial development there. He said staff will now consult with the community, but had no specifics on how that will occur.

The withdrawal followed an unusual Planning Commission meeting on June 11th when 450 people came and a record 171 of them signed up to give the Commission their views on the facility. BSCL President Randy Swart presented the resolution we had adopted unanimously on June 7, which reads:

"We support the goals of the three programs. There appears to be a need for additional homeless shelter space, for a detoxification facility and for a corrections facility to handle prerelease programs.

We deplore the rushed process by which the County is making its decision on this matter, sacrificing the opportunity for normal citizen input and the required staff work to provide data for normal decision-making. In particular, the possible negative aspects of the concept of co-location of the three programs should be more thoroughly explored.

We strongly disapprove of the proposed site for the facility. After hearing from the County staff and considering the three programs we believe they would have a negative impact on the park and the neighborhood and request the County Board to direct the County Manager to prepare a new proposal placing the facility in a more appropriate location, or placing the individual programs at separate sites.

We support acquisition of the land along Four Mile Run as an addition to Barcroft Park."

Swart also noted that after weeks of denying that there would be any violent criminals at the site, the County was now including assault in the list of crimes an inmate might be convicted of. This change had been made without noting that it was a change, confirming the view of many Barcrofters that unheralded program changes in the future might make the facility even more objectionable than its current design. Swart said that the document presented to the Planning Commission made it evident that whatever label the County chose to use for the corrections part of the facility, the closest plain English description was "jail."

Many thanks to the Barcrofters who attended meetings, wrote letters or made phone calls to make our concerns about this facility known.





COMMENT ON THE CRIME REPORT

Our crime rate is up sharply, and not just along the Columbia Pike border. In addition to the May crimes in this report, the newspapers reported in early June that a woman was raped in her Buchanan Gardens apartment by an acquaintance who has been jailed.

In May, 1960, neighborhood women residing on Woodstock Ct., 6th St. S. and part of Abingdon St. joined together to form a club they called the "Friendship Club". Now the club is celebrating its 30th year anniversary.

The first meeting of the club was at Alice Davis' home on Woodstock. Alice is one of ten original members still living in Barcroft. The Friendship Club established by-laws and has nominal dues. Club colors are green and white and their flower is the Lily-of-the-Valley. This year the club has begun to include men at the monthly meetings. Current President Peg Butner was elected last September.

With a purpose of neighborliness and goodwill it is primarily a social club, with members also participating in service projects such as collecting food at Thanksgiving for the Arlington County Shelter TACTS. At Christmastime, the club has "adopted" a family or two from Arlington's Sullivan house shelter to buy presents for. They have organized a Neighborhood Watch and also have social events such as an annual Christmas party and a picnic in June.


The Friendship club has a club poem to inspire them:
