Barcroft PTA Reception and Landscaping our Community House


7:00 pm, Thursday, June 4th at the Barcroft Community House, 800 S. Buchanan Street

Barcroft Elementary's PTA will host a reception at the community house at 7 p.m. on June 4, one-half hour before the regular meeting. The reception and a brief presentation by Barcroft's gifted principal, Miriam Hughey-Guy, during the regular meeting will give neighborhood residents an opportunity to learn more about the school and a chance for people involved with the school to learn more about the neighborhood. We will be cooperating to put on a Neighborhood Day event in the fall, so this is a very timely initiative by the school.

During the meeting the PTA will present awards to several members of the

community for their contributions to Barcroft Elementary this year. Among those to be honored are Scott Brinitzer for landscaping on the school grounds, and Bahar Hess and the ladies of the Women's Club on S. Buchanan Street for their volunteer work.

And by coincidence, the very same Scott Brinitzer who is being thanked for his volunteer work for the school will present his landscaping plan for the Community House during our regular meeting right after the reception. The plan appears inside this issue, and would be a radical departure from the scorched earth landscaping we now have.

At the right is an early version of Scott's plan for the Community House. It involves considerably more plantings than we have had in the past in an effort to place the Community House in a nicer setting, and to screen the sheds and fences of adjoining neighbors. There would be less open space in the yard for the 4th of July gathering. This is just one possible configuration of the four that Scott has prepared. It is time to make some choices.

The plan requires installation of a sprinkler system with an automatic timer, without which Scott believes we cannot maintain the grounds using our limited volunteer labor.

A new fence would replace the old chain link fence. The gazebo is a suggestion that outdoor weddings may be more popular as the Community House is used for more events. (At present most weekends are booked. The fee is still very low-call Tom Palance for details)

With the blessing of the BSCL Board, Scott has applied for a foundation grant to fund some of the improvements. The grant would be to support a joint program with Demeter House residents and Barcroft residents working together on the gardening chores.

Be sure to come to the meeting on Thursday, June 4th and make your views known on this landscaping plan.
