May Meeting: Final Landscape Plan for Community House Set for Review, Vote

A final vote on landscape plans for the community house is scheduled for the Barcroft School and Civic League's May meeting, on May 6 at 7:30 p.m. As anyone who has walked by the house since last fall can plainly see, the grounds have never looked better. But more work is in store -if the community approves. Discussion during the meeting is expected to focus on completion of the plan, and whether large events like the neighborhood's signature July celebration still can accommodated comfortably.

Last April, the community gave preliminary approval to the landscape blueprint drawn by Scott Brinitzer.

Scott has been the driving force behind the plan. By last fall, Scott had assembled an impressive roster of volunteers who gave up several weekends tilling and fertilizing the soil, planting new shrubs, trees, ground cover and bulbs, and sowing new grass. Last month, the community approved the expenditure of \$2,300 for an irrigation system -- purchased at a deep discount from its \$7,000 pricetag with the proceeds from a memorial fund for Scott's partner, Carroll LeTellier Jr., who died suddenly last December.

Now, Scott is ready to begin the final stage of his plan, which includes extensive planting in the rear of the yard, additional screening from the back yards neighbors, a picket fence, and possibly, a gazebo. Scott says his final plan will accommodate the many needs of a diverse community. It's meant to make the grounds a beautiful backdrop for a wide variety of community needs. from intimate conversation at a gathering or between neighbors meeting there after an evening stroll, to a more attractive and intentional setting for large events.

Indeed, the looks of the place have never been more important. The community severed its long relationship with a steady tenant, the Bulgarian Orthodox Church, in order to reclaim full use of the house. Now, the house must pay its way through rentals for receptions, parties and other events. The better the place looks, the more desirable it becomes for such events. At April's meeting, however, some community members expressed the view

that the landscaping should remain child-friendly and also offer room for large gatherings. The board has wrestled with ways to accommodate both the landscape plan and major events. Last year's vote of approval was preliminary in nature, supporting the landscaping concept but concerned that traditions be preserved. Now, the community will review what's been done, and decide what should come next.

A portion of the meeting will be held outside so that we can see more clearly the planned changes planned. With the sun setting at 8 p.m., arrive on time to see things while it's light!



On New Year's Eve, they played for the city of Ft. Lauderdale, FL. Locally, they appear at the Glen Echo swing dances, at Old Glory in Georgetown, and at Whitlow's here in Arlington.

The band has its own fancy web site (www.jstreetjumpers.com) maintained by Jeff's wife, Beth. On the website Jeff is described as *one of the busiest blues and swing drummers in the D.C. scene, having played thousands of gigs over more than 30 years. Before joining the Jumpers, Jeff worked with many big acts including Bo Diddley, Hank Ballard, The Clovers, Pine Top Perkins, and Sunnyland Slim.

When not working on that web site, Beth works as an administrator for a law firm. She has served as Barcroft School PTA president for several years now but hopes to pass the torch next year. Jeff and Beth have three children, Matt age 13 ½ who plays sax at Kenmore, Emily age 12 who also attends Kenmore, and Alexis age 7 who attends Barcroft School. The Lodsuns have lived in Barcroft for 12 ½ years.
